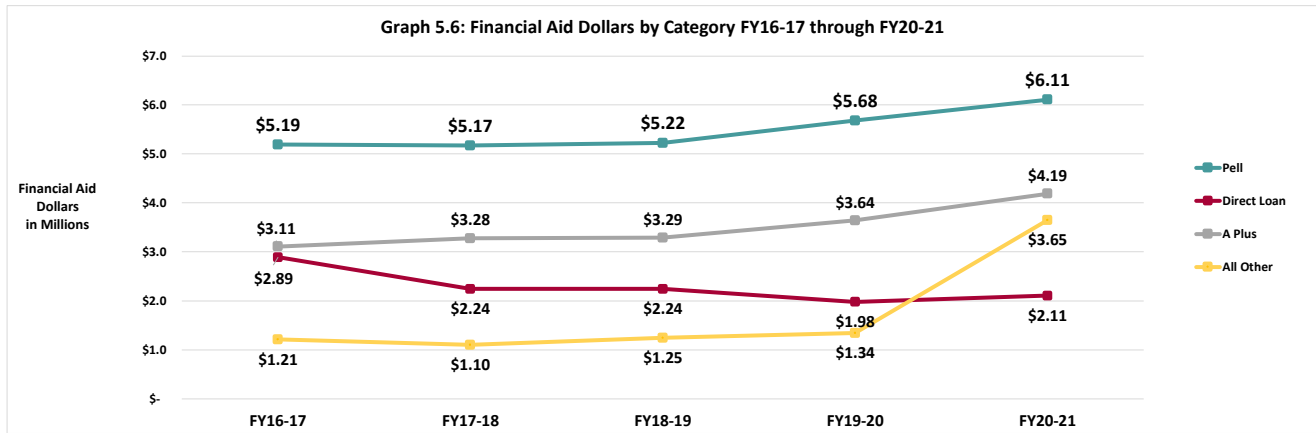

Graph 5.6 shows that financial aid dollars from Pell Grants have remained the largest financial aid revenue source for SCC and has remained a steady amount for the past 3 fiscal years.

The large increase in "All Other" financial aid funds can be attributed to CARES funds being allowed to support students, and this allotment was provided as financial aid.

The percent of Full-Time Students Receiving a Pell Grant Award looks at the number of students who had at least one of their Fall or Spring terms as a Full-Time student and also did or did not utilize a Pell Award. Since FY2017-2018, the percentage of full-time students utilizing a Pell Award has increased.

Graph 5.7 shows that the percentage of total operating revenue from financial aid has increased over the last 5 years. The large uptick for FY2020-2021 is largely due to COVID Relief funds.
