MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Board President Ehlmann. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On a motion by Lohmar and a second by Cilek, the agenda was approved. The motion carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT - APPROVAL TO PAY BILLS

Treasurer Lohmar presented the Treasurer's Report. Cash in bank \$6,149,845; total investments \$22,275,000 tuition and fees received to date \$16,016,570 local taxes received to date \$16,974,413; state appropriations received to date \$6,703,185 On a motion by Mack and a second by Stodden, the Treasurer's Report was accepted. The motion carried unanimously.

On a motion by Cilek and a second by Stodden, the Board approved payment of bills from the Operating Fund in the amount of \$3,598,933. The motion carried unanimously.

 professional artists on the topic of career paths for artists. She also participated in an evening event

- Garrett Foster (Engineering) ran a series of breakout sessions for the General Motors Robotics Challenge held on the SCC campus. Past and future activities include participating in IAC's virtual meetings four to five times per year and face-to-face hearings as needed. REPORT OF THE COLLEGE PRESIDENT

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Board President Ehlmann called for public comments.

Arnie "AC" Dienoff introduced himself and expressed concern related to the following:

- Testing and Balancing of Fine Arts Building HVAC Systems (under Award of Bids), as he feels there were companies in St. Charles County that could perform the work.
- Representation for Community College Education and Workforce Training Consortium Initiatives (under Award of Bids), as the award did not go through the normal bid process and he feels there will not be a return on the investment.
- Department of Public Safety Vehicle, as he feels that a less expensive Ford Escape should be purchased from a St. Charles County dealer, the normal bidding process should have been used rather than the state purchasing consortium, and the vehicle should be purchased outright rather than leased.
- *P-417 Tuition, Fees, and Refunds for Credit Classes* (under Board Policies and Procedures Update), as a law was passed by legislators for a tuition freeze and to his knowledge it has not expired, and he feels that staff should be laid off rather than passing the cost of decreasing enrollment numbers on to students.

No other public comments were made.

PROJECTED TAX LIABILITY NOTICE

The Board reviewed the projected tax liability notice for 2017, which will be submitted to the county registrar in preparation for notification to St. Charles County property owners of projected property tax rates as calculated by the taxing authorities in the county. The document was for information purposes,

did not require Board action, and did not commit the College to the rates presented. The 2017 projected debt service rate reflects a decrease of 0.0102 cents.

BOARD POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL UPDATE

P-417 Tuition, Fees, and Refunds for Credit Classes

On a motion by Lohmar and a second by Cilek, the Board approved the following tuition and fee adjustments for FY18, effective for the Summer 2017 semester.

General Tuition

Increase from \$98 to \$103* per credit hour (in-district) Increase from \$149 to \$154* per credit hour (out-of-district) Increase from \$215 to \$216 per credit hour (out of state)

Differential Tuition for Online Courses

\$118* per credit hour (in-district) \$169* per credit hour (out-of-district) \$231 per credit hour (out-of-state)

Nursing and Allied Health Fee

Increase from \$750 per semester to \$825 per semester

Welding Program Fee

New fee of \$825 per semester

*In February, a \$6 in-district tuition increase scenario was recommended. After further consideration, the recommendation was amended to a \$5 in-district increase per credit hour.

The motion carried unanimously.

AWARD OF BIDS

Representation for Community College Education and Workforce Training Consortium Initiatives On a motion by Lohmar and a second by Stodden, the Board approved securing the services of Downs Government Affairs, LLC. (DGA) in the amount of \$2,000 per month for one year to represent St. Charles Community College in connection with community college education and workforce training consortium initiatives. The motion carried unanimously. Funding Sources: Workforce Development and Contingency Funds

Contract Extension for Student Mental Health Counseling Services

On a motion by Cilek and a second by Mack, the Board approved contract renewal with Alternative Behavioral Care, d/b/a Thrive.Enrich.Empower, LLC, St. Peters, MO, to continue providing mental health counseling services for students at the current contracted rate of \$12,000.00 per month until the appropriate transition of services to a dedicated SCC Student Mental Health Counselor is complete. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source: Current Operating – Dean of Student Success*

Department of Public Safety Vehicle

On a motion by Stodden and a second by Cilek, the Board granted an award to Bommarito Ford, Hazelwood, MO, for purchase of a 2017 Ford Police Interceptor Utility AWD vehicle for the Department of Public Safety to provide security and patrolling on the main campus and the Dardenne Prairie property for a total cost of \$31,345.00 at an annual lease amount of \$7,836.25 for four years, after which SCC will purchase the vehicle for \$1.00. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source: General Operating – Department of Public Safety*

Purchase of Microscopes

On a motion by Lohmar and a second by Mack, the Board granted an award to Sheerin Scientific Company, Inc., Lenexa, KS, in the amount of \$19,310.46 for the purchase of microscopes for instructional purposes in the Anatomy and Physiology Labs. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source: Science Lab Fees*

Testing and Balancing of Fine Arts Building HVAC Systems

On a motion by Cilek and a second by Stodden, the Board approved a contract with Systems Testing and Analysis, Creve Coeur, MO, in the amount of \$19,125.00, plus a 5% contingency, for a total of \$20,081.25 to measure the Fine Arts Building HVAC system's expected performance, outcomes, comfort, and efficiency; to diagnose performance shortfalls; and to confirm that the design is meeting specifications as originally drafted. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source:* 2016/2017 *Maintenance & Repair Plan (50% state reimbursed)*

CLOSED SESSION

On a motion by Mack and a second by Lohmar, the Board voted to adjourn into Closed Session pursuant to RSMo 610.021.3. for the purpose of discussing hiring, firing, disciplining or promoting of particular employees by a public governmental body when personal information about the employee is discussed or recorded.
