## St. Charles Community College Board of Trustees Public Meeting Monday, August 21, 2017

#### **CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS**

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Board President Ehlmann. #### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Board President Ehlmann led the Board, staff, and audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES: REGULAR MEETING OF JULY 17, 2017

On a motion by Mack and a second by Cilek, minutes of the July 17, 2017, regular Board meeting were accepted as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

On a motion by Pundmann and a second by Lohmar, the agenda was approved. The motion carried unanimously.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT AND APPROVAL TO PAY BILLS

Treasurer Lohmar presented the Treasurer's Report. Cash in bank \$6,088,696; total investments \$16,930,000; tuition and fees received to date \$9,382,159; local taxes received to date \$249,194; state appropriations received to date \$1,403,489. On a motion by Cilek and a second by Mack, the

Treasurer's Report was accepted. The motion carried unanimously.

On a motion by Pundmann and a second by Cilek, the Board approved payment of bills from the Operating Fund in the amount of \$5,913,867. The motion carried unanimously.

### STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION REPORT

SCC's Student Government Association (SGA) president Shawn Malott introduced himself as a second year student who plans to transfer to St. Louis University after graduation. The SGA has not yet met this semester; their first meeting is planned for the week following Fall Fun Blitz in early September.

### FACULTY ASSOCIATION REPORT

Faculty Association president Cheryl Eichenseer reported the following:

- SCC Phi Beta Lambda (PBL) members Tori Ash and Bethany Graham competed in Business Ethics at the PBL National Leadership Conference June 24 – 27, 2017, in Anaheim, California. They placed first at the Missouri State PBL National Leadership Conference in the spring, qualifying them for the national conference where they placed eighth in the nation. This is the third consecutive year that SCC's chapter has been in the top ten business ethics teams at the national conference.
- Andrea Compton and Nancy Graviett, SCC PBL advisors, hosted a regional leadership conference at SCC on July 18, 2017, for Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) members and officers. The Creating Leaders and Unleashing Excellence (CLUE) was the first travelling conference offered by State FBLA and PBL officers. The conference was very successful, and coordinators are hoping to host again next year.
- Joyce Lindstrom attended the Oxbridge Conference, sponsored by the C.S. Lewis Foundation, with five days in Oxford and five days in Cambridge, England, investigating the theme *Irrigating Deserts, Cultivating Gardens; Pursuing Calling with Purpose and Hope.*
- New Health Information Management (HIM) certificate programs:
  - o Medical Billing and Coding Certificate
    - This is the start of a journey to earn highly valued stackable credentials. Students can earn the Certified Coding Associate (CCA) credential and will have the opportunity to move on to the Health Information Management Associate of Science (HIM-AS) degree program. Upon completion of the degree program, students can sit for the Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT) credential. SCC's affiliation agreements will also allow HIM-AS degreed students to transfer to a 4-year institution for their BS degree and the Registered Health Information Administrator (RHIA) credential.
  - Medical Assistant Certificate Front and Back Office Skills
    - This is another available pathway to earn highly valued stackable credentials. The new certificate program will prepare students to work in both front and back office settings, performing patient assessments as well as scheduling appointments and performing reimbursement functions. Once accredited, SCC graduates can earn the Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) or Registered Medical Assistant (RMA) credential. Health care settings in SCC's area are in great need of these professionals. Graduates can continue in their preferred area of specialty with SCC's LPN/RN programs or in the HIM-AS degree program.

- The SCC Honors Program is looking forward to the fall semester with the following Honors courses:
  - The Hero We Need: Superheroes in US Society: taught by Rachael McWhorter and Vicki Herbel
  - Your Brain on Drugs: The Biology and Psychopharmacology of Heroin: taught by Mara Vorachek-Warren and Mitch Harden
  - o Middle Earth and Morality: taught by Christy Gant and Charles DeBord
- Ellen Wilson, professor of geography/GIS, spent June 2 8, 2017, as an Advanced Placement (AP) reader for Human Geography in Cincinnati, Ohio. Wilson was one of 862 readers who reviewed 201,000 exams.
- Kyle Linden, assistant professor of mathematics, drove a mobile medical unit across the country while volunteering for the nonprofit, pro-life organization, *Save the Storks*.
- SCC Center Stage Theatre presented You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown from July 26 30, 2017. The production was directed by Lynne Snyder with musical direction by Gene Ditch, set and lighting design by Jeff Roop, and costume design by Deborah Phillips. As a show with multi-generational appeal, over 1,200 were in the audience including many children, some of whom were in a dance company and wore their Charlie Brown costumes to the performance.
- Additional performances for this year's season include:

- In June, English faculty members Jayme Novara, Corey Porter, Jeff Miller, and Joe Baumann attended the 2017 Conference on Acceleration in Developmental Education, the premiere conference on co-requisite models in teaching, in Denver, Colorado, where they gave their wellreceived presentation, "From Tonto to Tammet and *Maus* to Men: Topics in Co-Requisite Education as a Means to Student Buy-In." In addition to providing an overview of the successful structure of co-requisite modeling in ENG-101 and ENG-096 at SCC, they discussed various topical approaches they take in teaching their composition courses. Subjects discussed included Disability Studies, Comics as Literature, Identity and Personal History, and Gender in the World.
- Over the course of the summer, Joe Baumann, instructor of English, had a number of short stories accepted for and published in the following journals, one of which is based in Australia:

- Lindsay Brand designed bookmarks which were handed out by the English department to commemorate the total solar eclipse. The bookmarks highlight quotes from William Shakespeare and Virginia Woolf.
- Christina Gant and Anastasia Biermann (English) participated in AP scoring in Tampa, Florida, from June 11 18, 2017, reading approximately 1,600 essays.
- Christina Gant and Cathy Daugherty (PTK advisors) accompanied chapter officers to an Honors in Action seminar at East Central College in Union, Missouri, on July 15, 2017.

- Christina Gant judged two poetry contests for a local writing society over the summer.
- The work of Alison Ouelette-Kirby and Noah Kirby remains the feature of a solo exhibition until October 6, 2017, at the William and Florence Schmidt Art Center at Southwestern Illinois College. The opening reception was held on August 24, 2017. Oulette-Kirby's work was also featured at the Rosen Outdoor Sculpture Competition & Exhibition at the Blowing Rock Art & History Museum (BRAHM) in Blowing Rock, North Carolina.

### ESTABLISH DATE FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX LEVY

On a motion by Cilek and a second by Lohmar, a Public Hearing on the College's property tax rates for operating and debt service purposes, as required by law, was set for Monday, September 18, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. as part of the Board of Trustees meeting.

#### **BOARD POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL REVISION**

The Board reviewed proposed revisions to the Board Policies and Procedures Manual. Action will be requested at the September 18, 2017, regular meeting. Revision highlights are as follows:

#### P-226 Auxiliary Enterprises

**P-226.2** updates the fee schedule for the Child Development Center with a general increase of 1.5% and no change to the student, staff, and faculty overall discount of 18%.

#### P-303 Grounds Restrictions

*P-303.4* prohibits the use of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS), drones, and other model aircraft on property owned or controlled by St. Charles Community College, with the exception of official college

purposes or in the College Meadows area, where use is regulated by St. Charles County park regulations.

*P-303.5* requires advance approval from College administration for overnight parking or other use of campus parking lots, athletic fields, and other College property by outside groups or individuals.

### AWARD OF BIDS

#### Change in Authorized Service Provider for Xerox Maintenance Agreement

On a motion by Mack and a second by Cilek, the Board approved a change in award from Progressive Business, St. Louis, MO, (approved in February 2015) to Document Management Consultants, St. Louis, MO, for an estimated amount of \$60,000.00 per year for the maintenance agreement, including supplies, on Xerox copiers located in the Copy Center. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source: FY18 Operating Budget – Copy Center* 

#### Intercollegiate Athletics Insurance Renewal

On a motion by Pundmann and a second by Cilek, the Board approved renewal of contracts with Mutual of Omaha through Ascension Benefits & Insurance Solutions for a total annual amount of \$25,711.00, effective August 1, 2017, for athletics injury insurance for the women's softball, men's baseball, and men's and women's soccer teams. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source: FY18 Operating Budget – Athletics Department* 

#### **MOBIUS Annual Membership**

On a motion by Lohmar and a second by Cilek, the Board approved renewal of the College's annual membership with Missouri Bibliographic Information User System (MOBIUS) in the amount of \$37,275.81 for consortium membership fees, projected assessment fees, software maintenance, support, and faculty/student access to multiple databases in the MOBIUS consortium for fiscal year 2017/18. The motion carried unanimously. *Funding Source: FY18 Operating Budget – Learning Resource Center* 

#### PERSONNEL RECOMMENDATIONS
