Fall enrollment figures faring better than projected

The college is only four weeks into the fall semester, but college officials are already examining enrollment counts as part of the census that provides valuable data about the academic term.

The original projection for enrollment was set at -6 percent last spring. This decline was consistent with state-wide trends for community colleges, where enrollments have been declining for several years.

When the initial 20-day census report was released on Sept. 13, it was clear SCC had made significant gains, with credit hours at -1.9 percent, FTE at -1.0 percent and headcount at -2.8 percent. The numbers have been provided by the Department of Institutional Research and Grants as part of their preliminary census report.
