SCC PLANS TO EXPAND WEST, BUILDING A REGIONAL WORKFORCE INNOVATION CENTER



St. Charles Community College plans to expand west, building its Regional Workforce Innovation Center on land the college recently purchased in unincorporated St. Charles County near the new David Hoekel I-70 Interchange close to Wentzville and Foristell. Construction will begin this spring, with anticipated completion in 2025.

Technical programs, like advanced manufacturing, are planned

for the 40,000 square-foot state-of-the-art facility.

"The programs will meet the needs of business and industry and prepare students for high demand careers in the region," said Barbara Kavalier, Ph.D., SCC president.

SCC will use \$10 million in funds from Proposition Community College (Prop CC), passed by voters in August 2020, \$10 million in matching funds the college received through the American Rescue Plan funds allocated by the state, and \$4.4 million from the MoExcels Workforce Initiative through the Missouri Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development.

"I'm excited to join St. Charles Community College as the college grows workforce programing and builds a new Regional Workforce Innovation Center in western St. Charles County," said Wiemann. "The new campus will have such an impact on business and industry and the growth of our region."

Wiemann resigned his seat in the Missouri House, where he is serving as Speaker Pro Tem, the second highest ranking member of the Missouri House of Representatives. He was first elected in 2014 and re-elected in 2016, 2018 and 2020 to the Missouri State Legislature. He represents a part of St. Charles County which includes the entire city of Cottleville along with a portion of O'Fallon, St. Peters, Dardenne Prairie and Weldon Spring. In the private sector, Wiemann is president and CEO of Midwest Physician Insurance Advisors, an insurance brokerage firm that specializes in medical malpractice insurance. Wiemann has over twenty years of healthcare and insurance industry related experience working for hospitals, a physician staffing company, health insurance carrier, along with several insurance brokerage firms.
