SCC RECEIVES OVER \$400,000 FROM STATE OF MISSOURI TO EXPAND NURSING PROGRAM

St. Charles Community College will receive \$424,500 from the state of Missouri, as part of the \$5 million in grants for 13 colleges and universities announced by Governor Parson in December, to expand its nursing program.

The funds will be used for technology, equipment, and supplies to make its nursing program available in a second location, at its new Regional Workforce Innovation Center, currently under construction in Wentzville. The second location will allow additional students in western parts of the college's service area to benefit from SCC's highly regarded nursing program.

Giving more students the ability to enter the workforce as entry-level nurses, the second location also will help to meet the healthcare needs of the surrounding community.
